Hunting


Some of the finest upland hunting can be found just south of Weyburn. Hunters from across North America travel to the region to hunt Hungarian Partridge and Sharptail Grouse. As well, come late fall, Weyburn is home to a very healthy population of waterfowl. Canadian residents can find exceptional big game opportunities including whitetail deer, moose and elk.

Fishing

Nickle Lake is only 5 minutes east of Weyburn on highway #39, Nickle Lake has walleye, perch and northern pike and is periodically stocked. A fish cleaning area is supplied. There are two boat launch areas and a floating dock for loading and unloading passengers.

Prize walleye and big pike await you half an hour east of Weyburn at the Rafferty Reservoir with over 50 km of pristine fishing available. For anglers and recreational boaters, the boat launch facility at Mainprize Regional Park provides access to the Rafferty Reservoir.

Snowmobile Trails

200 KM of trail that connects Weyburn with the towns of Griffin, Creelman, Corning and Stoughton, as well as Moose Mountain Snowmobile Club trail system. The Weyburn shelter is located just east of the city. The shelter was built in 2009 and consists of an insulated building with wood stoves and 12-volt lighting. The shelter offers washrooms, fire pits, and BBQs. The perfect stop for lunch during your ride, bring your hot dogs with you, as hot dog sticks are also provided.

Arts & CULTURE

Credit Union Gallery

205 Coteau Avenue

Focused on emerging local talent, this gallery often gets the honour of being the first show for many artists.

Soo Line Historical Museum

411 Riverfront Road

The museum displays the largest private silver collection in the world along with articles and artifacts of the past from Weyburn and surrounding area.

The Big Wheel

45 Bison Avenue, located inside the Library
The wheel is a geographic record of Weyburn's history reflected in a mosaid by local artist Joan Linley.

Tommy Douglas Performing Arts Centre 400 10th Avenue S

The centre hosts a variety of productions and events throughout the year. Make sure to visit the T.C. Douglas archive room while you are there.

Tommy Douglas Statue

Located on Highway #39 East at the Boardwalk
Proudly memorializing the "Father of Medicare"; the bronze
statue stands on the banks along the Riverfront Boardwalk.
Produced by sculptor Leah Vivot as a tribute to the long-standing
premier of Saskatchewan (1944-1961) who began his career in
Weyburn.

Turner Curling Museum

327 Mergens Street NW

Touted as "first in the world", this unique museum is of interest to curlers and non-curlers alike. The collection features many rare historical curling pieces.

Walk of Fame

157 3rd Street NE, in front of City Hall

The Walk of Fame recognizes local individuals for outstanding athletic, cultural, academic or humanitarian achievements.

Water Tower

400 10th Avenue S

This Municipal Heritage Property was constructed in 1910 and it stands over 90 feet to its peak.

Weyburn Art Gallery

540 5th Street NE

The Weyburn Art Gallery hosts exhibitions on local, provincial, and nationally known artist. Exhibitions are shown on a revolving schedule. Located in the Credit Union Sparks Centre, this facility also offers a wide variety of art classes, is home to the Weyburn Pottery Club, and houses the City of Weyburn's Permanent Collection (a collection of art documenting the cultural history of Southast Saskatchewan).

Weyburn Heritage Village

424 10th Avenue S - behind Signal Hill Arts Centre
Buildings and artifacts make up a collection that will take you
back in time. Give your senses a workout as you see, hear,
feel and taste the past.

Weyburn Pioneer Woman Sculpture
Intersection of 5th Street and 1st Avenue NE
The sculpture honors the role of pioneer
women in the family life who met the
challenge of isolation and a harsh
environment.

OUTDOORS

Jubilee Park

1st Avenue NE

The park boasts a number of ball diamonds, soccer and football fields, jogging and walking paths, tennis courts, picnic areas, playground, and an outdoor skating rink in the winter months.

River Park

S of HWY 39

River Park, with its beautiful and manicured tree lines, is the jewel of Weyburn's park system.

Tatagwa Parkway Trail System

Weyburn's picturesque Tatagwa Trail system and parks are an ideal place to walk your dog, go for a run, ride your bike, or boost your happiness by simply observing nature's beauty. Tatagwa Parkway consists of four areas - Signal Hill Trail, Red Coat Trail, Souris Valley Trail, and Silver Heights Trail. Picnic tables and park benches are placed throughout the Parkway.



OUTDOORS

River Park Spray Park

In River Park, off Confederation Drive

Features a large dump bucket, multiple spray elements and ground sprayers. Playground and disc golf are in close proximity.

Weyburn Community Dog Park

1st Avenue NW at Aylmer Street

The fenced park is 2.8 acres and provides separate areas for large and small dogs. The dog park provides a safe environment for dogs to exercise and socialize.

Weyburn Therapeutic Animal Park Inc.

Souris Valley Road (on the grounds of Tatagwa View)

A wide variety of animals present at the park, from goats, to ponies and many different birds. The park is open to everyone to come meet, learn about and enjoy the animals at no cost.

The park is open annually to the public during the summer months.

Young Fellows Paddling Pool

This supervised paddling pool offers fun for the whole family. Washrooms are available during operation hours.

Spray Park at Don Mitchell Park

Spray park features hand sensors to turn on water, dump buckets, a rainbow of colours that spray, canon sprayers and numerous geysers.
